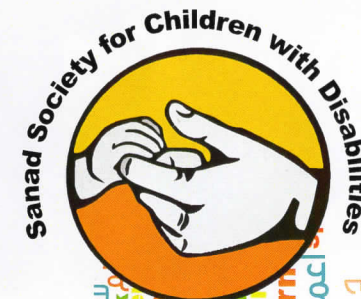

The society was founded in 2012 in Nablus to provide differentiated services for children with disabilities. Sanad was founded by a group of passionate mothers many of whom have children with disabilities and who believe in the importance of enhancing the capabilities and self concepts of disabled children so they can lead more meaningful, productive lives.

Mission:

We look forward to providing comprehensive and specialized services for children with disabilities in order to help them learn to modify their behavior so that it is more socially acceptable. We also look forward to increasing the long term capacity of team working with them to meet the needs of disabled children through lobbying and advocacy activities with local universities to encourage research and development in this field.

Vision:

Actively working to enable children with disabilities to reach a stage of relative independence so they are less of a burden on their families and on society and are better able to make successful use of their capabilities to lead fulfilling lives.

Our Objectives:

- Raising awareness of the importance of early detection and intervention, in addition to the importance of accepting the child's condition as a necessary first step in working to determine and implement appropriate accommodations.
- Early diagnosis of disabilities so children can be enrolled in an appropriate program.
- Developing the physical and social capacities of children with disabilities to increase their independence and engagement in life.
- Development of the skills of the team working with these children by training university graduates who are specializing in appropriate interventions for children with disabilities, and by enhancing their spirit of volunteerism.
- Supporting parents of children with disabilities and providing them with training so they have the necessary skills to care for and to enhance the capabilities of their children.
